
Although Mom's physical health was declining over the past few years her memory was good and she loved to visit. She continued to trust in God and she began to express her desire to go Home to be with Jesus.

Linda Boehr (nee Janzen) passed away peacefully at the Spruce Manor Special Care Home in Dalmeny, SK, on December 25, 2020, at the age of 97.
