## Life Story

Esther was born on October 30, 1920 to Isaac & Susan Fehr near Hepburn, SK. She reached the age of 100 years. She met Isaac Giesbrecht who was from the Waldheim area at a School Luncheon Box Social. They were married on December 31, 1941 – it was a very cold day (-27 degrees)!

Esther gave her heart to the Lord and was baptized in her younger years. Isaac & Esther were blessed with 3 children: Edwin, Edna & Jerry.

They farmed until 1974 when Isaac started to have heart problems. Esther had to work hard on the farm because of her husband's health. They then retired from the farm & moved into Martensville. They resided here until 1997, until after Isaac had yet another heart attack. At this point Isaac moved into Parkridge Care Home with Esther moving shortly thereafter into Saskatoon Lord Nelson Apartments, a 5-minute drive away from Parkridge so she could visit him every day, which she did.

After Isaac's passing in February of 2002 Esther moved back to Martensville where she took her granddaughter Nicole in with her and cared for her for about 14 years. In 2017 just before her 97 birthday she moved into Warman Retirement Care Home, a private home. At the end of November 2019, she got pneumonia, & was admitted to SPH & a couple weeks later they transferred her to SCH. She miraculously recovered & was placed in the Saskatoon Convalescent Home for 10 days & from there she was able to move to Dalmeny Spruce Manor Special Care Home at the beginning of February, where her brother Lesly as residing, just on time to celebrate his 94th birthday! Her desire was to spend her last part of life on earth with Lesly -God granted this to her. The DSM Care Home moved her to three different rooms while she resided there, which she didn't like at all. She was a settled kind of lady & didn't like 'relocating.' She was afraid people would not find her for a visit. She was a social person, always waiting for a visitor to stop by. She resided in Dalmeny until her passing on Sunday, April 18, 2021.

Esther enjoyed making crafts, fishing & going to the lake with Corney & Albena, her sister, once Isaac & her were retired from the farm. She was such a caring person & would always find someone to give care to, like babysitting the neighborhood children in Martensville, her granddaughter Nicole & an elderly lady Mrs. Janzen who also resided in
