Nora’s Life Story

Nora Hiebert was born to Jacob and Katharina Hiebert on August 30, 1945 and was the youngest of 11 children. She grew up on a dairy farm east of Gruenthal, Sk. and helped on the farm until it was sold in 1962. At this time, she took a job at the Rosthern Crippled Children’s home and loved working and caring for the children at the home until 1964. Her roommate during this time was Joyce Adrian; and it’s been said that they got into a little bit of trouble together. Knowing Joyce and Nora, we know they had lots of fun together.

Nora married the love of her life, Peter J. Fehr, on September 26, 1964. The two of them took care of Henry and Helen Janzen’s farm for their first winter together while Henry & Helen went to Bible School. In 1965 they bought the farm east of Osler with Pete’s brother, Bill (Lillian) Fehr. They worked together to build their farm for a few years until Bill and Lillian decided to take over the farm near Hague, Sk in 1970.

Nora always said she would NEVER marry a dairy farmer, but when they bought the farm together she was a huge contributor to its success. They farmed there for 46 years until 2011 when they sold it.

Pete and Nora have 3 children together: Crystal in 1967, Colleen in 1969, and Keith in 1974. Nora was hard working, hospitable, and generous. She loved to host family gatherings and we were often amazed at how quickly she could whip up a meal or fasma. Henry Wiebe moved into the home in 1973 to help with the farm. Mom was very fond of Henry and he became a huge part of the family. We have always considered him a big brother.

Nora loved to garden & clean her home. Anyone who would visit would be welcomed by fresh baking or garden produce. She loved music and would often have music playing while she worked. As young kids, she and Dad made us sing together and we had several singing engagements in churches. She loved making meals and ensured that there was always a place for a lonely person at the family table. She would often make soup and take it to widowers. Oh how we loved her soup! She loved her family and was the happiest surrounded by the people she loved.
