John 14: 2-3 Alice Luella Baerg (nee Andres) entered into her eternal home at the age of 94 on March 20, 2022. She was born on September 12th, 1927 to John P. and Anna Andres. She lived in the Hepburn area until 1943 helping on the farm which she really enjoyed. She accepted Christ as her personal Saviour at the age of 8, her mother had explained the way of salvation to her. Mom was baptized at the age of 12 and joined the Hepburn MB Church where she enjoyed her new life in Christ.

At the age of 16 mom left home to work in the Warman Hospital for 2 years, then for the next 12 years she was a nurses aide at St. Paul's Hospital in Saskatoon. She also worked 5 years at Extendicare and 15 years at Spruce Manor in Dalmeny. This was the kind of work she really enjoyed as it gave her the opportunity to share her faith with her co-workers and patients. Mom had a great sense of humour, loved to joke around and she always made people smile whenever they crossed paths.
