Life Story

Michele was born in North Battleford and grew up on a farm near Wilkie, Saskatchewan, as the first child to Iver and Darleene. Michele accepted Jesus as her personal Savior as a young girl, and she lived an intentional life serving Jesus. She attended the University of Saskatchewan and after two years, was accepted in the College of Veterinary Medicine. She loved her kids with all of her heart but made it known several times she was really looking forward to grandchildren. She became a grandma in 2020 when Davin was born and he called her "Gram." This past year has been very exciting for her with Sienna, Pedro, and now baby Noah's arrival.

Michele fought a long and courageous battle with cancer. She was first diagnosed in December 2007 and then got her second diagnosis in April 2020. She fought so hard, not because of fear of death, but so she could spend every precious moment she could with her family. Even until the very end, she exhibited wisdom, hope, and God-given strength.
